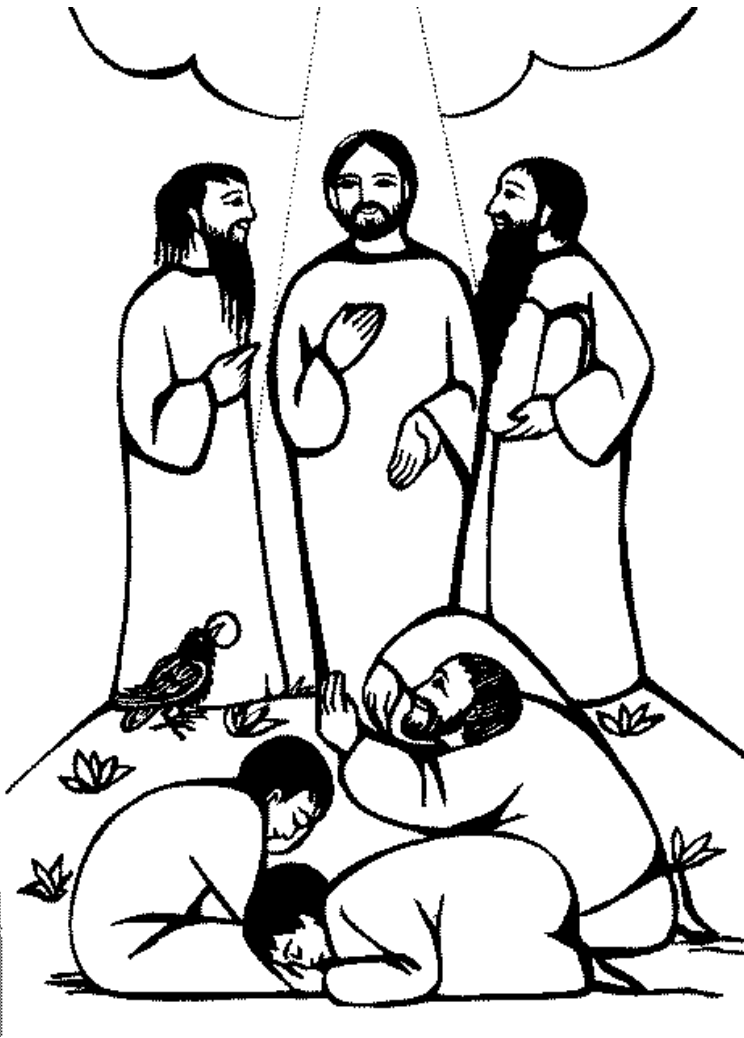

Background to Today's Readings: *(for preparation before the service or study at home).*

Isaiah 6:1-8 through a vision in the temple, the eighth-century prophet Isaiah is called by God to announce judgement against Israel. Like other prophets, Isaiah is initially hesitant because of his awareness of his sin and his shortcomings, but when the Lord call, Isaiah responds, "Here am I; send me!"

1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Paul delivers in a nutshell the story of the gospel that was given to him. In the lineage of the Christian faith, we have received the good news of God's love from generations of believers before us, and we continue to tell this story to the world.

Luke 5:1-11 Jesus' teaching of God's word has begun to draw great crowds. For Simon, James, and John, Jesus' teaching inspires hospitality, then obedience, and then risk. After Jesus' creative power is revealed, fear and amazement lead these three fishermen to leave everything behind in order to become apostles.

VESTRY PREPERATION Feb 24, 2019

The Annual vestry Meeting is a legal requirement and follows Diocesan rules and guidelines. In accordance with legal requirements, Diocesan custom, rules of order, and best practices, please note the following:

1. Items or issues to be raised at Vestry must be submitted to the Church Wardens in writing in the form of a motion at least one week prior to the meeting. This is to ensure that adequate time is allotted for discussion and that any necessary background research or preparation can be done. They will become part of the Agenda to be approved at the beginning of the meeting. It is our custom to approve the Agenda at that time and no new items may be added after this approval. All discussions at Vestry must be a debate on a specific motion, following its introduction and not beforehand. A motion must have a mover and seconder to be considered.
2. A question is simply that. It is not the opening of a debate, since only motions are debated.
3. If a motion is debated, rules and courtesy suggest that no speaker speak more than once on any motion, unless there is a need for clarification. Movers and seconders of motions may speak once to present the motion and once again before the vote, if desired.
4. A motion requesting a new programme or expenditure must be presented with full details of the programme and sources of funding.
5. Motions presented without previous notice will be deferred to the Corporation and/or next regular meeting of Parish Council.

READINGS FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

February 10, 2019

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.” The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: “Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!” Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: “Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.” Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?” And I said, “Here am I; send me!”

A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Now I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

Response: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, ^{he} saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, “Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.” Simon answered, “Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.” When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!” For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; ^{and} so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, “Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.” When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.
